5. GENERAL CONDITIONS – ENZOOTIC DISEASES REGULATIONS

Prior approval: Prior approval from the Inspector in Charge (Stock) is required to import into Western Australia equines which are exempt from treatment and/or testing under Section 7.4. Telephone: (08) 9368 3370, Facsimile: (08) 9474 2479.

Liver Fluke Restricted Area: The cities, shires and localities of Albany, Armadale, Augusta-Margaret River, Bridgetown-Greenbushes, Bunbury, Busselton, Capel, Chittering, Collie, Dandaragan, Dardanup, Denmark, Donnybrook-Balingup, Esperance, Gingin, Harvey, Jerramungup, Kalamunda, Mandurah, Manjimup, Mundaring, Murray, Nannup, Northam, Perth Metropolitan Area, Ravensthorpe, Rockingham, Serpentine-Jarrahdale, Swan, Toodyay, Wanneroo, Waroona.

Kimberley: The local government districts of Broome, Halls Creek, West Kimberley and Wyndham-East Kimberley.

Liver Fluke Test Exempt Area:

- (i) The Northern Territory, and,
- (ii) Queensland, north and west of the line of the road which runs from Hungerford to Thargomindah to Quilpie to Adavale to Blackall to Jericho to Alpha to Clermont to Mount Douglas on the Gregory Development Road, to Bowen via Collinsville on the Bowen Development Road; and,
- (iii) South Australia, north of Highway 32 from the New South Wales border to Peterborough, Highway 83 from Peterborough to Carrieton, and north of the boundaries of the Counties of Dalhousie and Frome from Carrieton to Port Augusta, and those areas of Eyre Peninsula north of County Flinders.

Tick Infested Area: That part of Western Australia north of the 20th parallel with the exception of Wallal, Billiluna and Ngulubi Stations.

Identification: Equines older than 6 months of age are required to be identified by means of a permanent legible/readable brand, or some other approved identification.

Certification: The original *Interstate Entry of Equines into Western Australia* certificate (AD1061) is to accompany the stock; the duplicate is to be forwarded by post or facsimile to the appropriate office of the Department of Agriculture Western Australia as shown below. This certificate may be used as a Notice to Import under the Agriculture and Related Resources (Declared Plants and Restricted Animals) Regulations 1982.

Notification: The owner is to notify the Inspector at the office appropriate to the point of entry at least three days before the estimated time of arrival (ETA) of the animals at the point of entry. The carrier should confirm the ETA between 10 and 24 hours prior to the ETA.

Inspection: Animals must be inspected within 14 days prior to commencement of direct movement to Western Australia and meet the requirements included in the declarations overleaf and the additional requirements described below in Section 6. Animals will be inspected again at the point of entry into Western Australia.

Fees: An inspection fee will be charged for each consignment of stock arriving in Western Australia. A consignment is defined as one or more animals from a separate property of origin or going to a separate destination property. The costs of any tests or treatments, fodder and tending of the stock will be the responsibility of the owner or agent of the owner of the stock as the case may be.

WARNING: At any time after entering Western Australia, imported stock, and stock with which they may have had contact, and land on which they may have run, may be deemed as being suspected of being diseased, if any stock or land with which the imported stock may have had contact prior to entry is subsequently found to be diseased.

6. CONDITIONS – AGRICULTURE AND RELATED RESOURCES PROTECTION ACT

The following conditions apply to equines as they are classified as Restricted Animals:

- (i) Equines, after inspection by owner/manager, shall be held in areas free of Declared Plants.
- (ii) Removal of animals from the place of inspection shall be by road, air or rail transport.
- (iii) Equines found to be infested with seeds or burrs of Declared Plants or taxa not permitted in Western Australia on inspection at the Entry Inspection Post will be cleaned at the importer's expense, or forwarded to the property of destination under quarantine and may be subject to further inspection at the importer's expense.
- (iii) Livestock transport is to be washed out at the inspection point and all bedding and fodder destroyed.

7. TICK INSPECTION AND TREATMENT – ENZOOTIC DISEASES REGULATIONS

- 7.1 Equines moving to the **Tick Free Area** in Western Australia must be free of tick. If from other than a **Tick Free Area** the animals must have a clean inspection and a supervised treatment by an Inspector immediately prior to movement unless moving to the **Tick Infected Area** from a property in the Northern Territory not under movement restrictions due to chemical resistant tick.

8. LIVER FLUKE TREATMENT AND TESTING – ENZOOTIC DISEASES REGULATIONS

8.1 Equines less than 18 months old, unless exempt by Section 8.3, are required to have the following:

- (i) Faecal sampling by a veterinarian or Inspector and a negative Faecal Egg Sedimentation Test for liver fluke within 14 days prior to entry into Western Australia. Horses must not be faecal sampled within 14 days after administration of any treatment for liver fluke.
- (ii) A treatment for liver fluke administered by a veterinarian immediately prior to movement or entry into Western Australia or as directed at the Entry Inspection Post. (In Western Australia, the treatment is triclabendazole at 12mg/kg body weight (BW) administered by a veterinarian).
- (iii) A treatment for liver fluke between 35-49 days after entry to Western Australia.
- (iv) A negative Faecal Egg Sedimentation Test for liver fluke between 90-100 days after entry to Western Australia.

Note: Equines moved to a property in the Liver Fluke Restricted Area in Western Australia must not be grazed on irrigated land or land where the animal/s or its/their faeces may have contact with water courses, or other surface waters until released from the Imported Stock Quarantine Notice.

Equines imported into the Kimberley and then moved from the Kimberley to another part of the State require a treatment for liver fluke administered by a veterinarian at the Entry Inspection Post or immediately prior to movement from the Kimberley.

8.2 Equines more than 18 months old, unless exempt by Section 8.3 or 8.4, are required to have the following:

- (i) Faecal sampling by a veterinarian or Inspector and a negative Faecal Egg Sedimentation Test for liver fluke within 14 days prior to entry (and not sooner than 14 days after the administration of any treatment for liver fluke).
- (ii) A treatment for liver fluke to be administered by a veterinarian immediately prior to movement and within 48 hours prior to arrival in Western Australia or at the Entry Inspection Post. (In Western Australia, the treatment is triclabendazole at 12mg/kg body weight (BW) administered by a veterinarian).

Note: Equines moved to a property in the Liver Fluke Restricted Area in Western Australia must not be grazed on irrigated land or land where the animal/s or its/their faeces may have contact with water courses, or other surface waters until released from the Imported Stock Quarantine Notice.

8.3 Exemption for equines originating from the Liver Fluke Test Exempt Area of Australia:

- (i) Equines that have been born and grazed solely in the Liver Fluke Test Exempt Area defined in Section 5, and are accompanied by a declaration by the owner to this effect, are exempted from the requirement for a pre-entry Faecal Egg Sedimentation Test.

Equines entering the Kimberley in Western Australia, are also exempt from pre-entry treatment for liver fluke. However, equines imported into the Kimberley and then moved from the Kimberley to another part of the State require a treatment for liver fluke administered by a veterinarian at the Entry Inspection Post or immediately prior to movement from the Kimberley.

8.4 Exemption for performance horses more than 18 months old entering Western Australia for not more than 28 days and for the sole purpose of performance competition:

Performance horses entering Western Australia for not more than 28 days for the sole purpose of performance competition are exempt from testing and treatment if they meet all the following criteria;

- (i) The owner provides a declaration in writing or evidence that the horses are entering the State for the sole purpose of performance competition.
- (ii) The duration of the stay is no more than 28 days.
- (iii) The property of destination has been approved in writing by an Inspector who found the property to be free from the vector snail of liver fluke and to have facilities for the stabling and exercise of the horse(s). The Inspector in Charge (Stock) on (08) 9368 3370 will issue the owner with an Approval Notice.
- (iv) The horse(s) will be under movement restrictions imposed under an Imported Stock Quarantine Notice.
- (v) In the Liver Fluke Restricted Area defined in Section 5, all faeces from untreated horses is collected from within the approved facilities and rendered sterile by composting for 14 days or by burning.
- (vi) The horse(s) is/are not to leave the approved property unless the owner/manager has received from, and is in possession of a Permit to Move issued by an inspector to move the horse(s) off the property to another approved place of quarantine, being the place shown in the Permit to Move.
- (vii) Any proposed extension of stay beyond 28 days is approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock. An application for extension must be made prior to the expiry of the permitted 28 days.

(vii) Horses remain in quarantine until they leave the State.
